As Mother's Day approaches, I did some research. How did Mother's Day start in our country? "In its modern form the holiday originated in the United States, where it is observed on the second Sunday in May to honor mothers. Anna Jarvis of Philadelphia, whose mother had organized women's groups to promote friendship and health, originated Mother's Day. On May 12, 1907, she held a memorial service at her late mother's church in Grafton, West Virginia. Within 5 years virtually every state was observing the day, and in 1914 U.S. President Woodrow Wilson made it a national holiday. Over time the day was expanded to include others, such as grandmothers and aunts, who played mothering roles. What had originally been primarily a day of honor became associated with the sending of cards and the giving of gifts, however, and, in protest against its commercialization, Jarvis spent the last years of her life trying to abolish the holiday she had brought into being." This is rather a sad story of something intended as honoring our mothers, but the world commercialized it. So, dear Sisters in Christ, we look to the One who created us, celebrating one another in Him as we care and nurture those He has given us, whether by natural birth , adoption, or cherished chosen oneswe look to Him.
