

## "Teachable Moments"

OBJECTIVE: The focus in this lesson will be on God's relationship with people He chooses to be His own. Over the next few lessons we will learn how to be a good friend and how to choose friends carefully. Abraham's friendship with God will provide a great example for this study.

- **Simple Truths**: The simple truths in this lesson will help your children learn how important friendship really is to God. He does want us to be His friend, but He chooses those friends very carefully and He wants us to do the same. This lesson is intended to be introductory.
- Activity Pages: These are learning opportunities, so enjoy them together. Be sure to use the four-step Truth Seeking guides presented in previous lessons.
  - #1 PRAYER TIME STORY TIME
  - #2 Abram's Ancestors Abram's Homeland
  - #3 The HAND of the LORD
  - #4 Abraham . . . A Friend of God (word search)
  - #5 GENESIS Review I Wonder??? (It isn't necessary to complete this entire activity in one sitting. You decide what is best for your family.)

## Simple Truths

GOD chooses His friends.

#### How do people become God's friends?

- --We can not earn friendship with God.
- --God knows our hearts; He **chooses** and **calls** to Himself those he wants for His friends.

"But you, O Israel, my servant, Jacob, whom <u>I have chosen</u>, you descendants of Abraham my friend, I took you from the ends of the earth, from its farthest corners <u>I called you</u>. I said, 'You are my servant', <u>I have chosen you</u> and have not rejected you." (Isaiah 41:8-9)

"... *I have called you friends.* for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but **I chose you** and appointed you to go and bear fruit---fruit that will last..." (John 15:15, 16)

#### GOD wants us to be His friend.

#### How can I be a friend of God?

--Jesus told His disciples they must accept what He says and obey His commands if you want to be His friend. --What we say and do is very important to God.

*"Jesus said--You are my friends* **if** *you do what I command. " (John 15:14)* 

#### What does God do for His friends?

--He helps us to learn about Him and He answers our prayers. In fact, He loves to hears our prayers

"... I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you... Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name." (John 15: 15b and 16b)

- --As our friend, God's love is everlasting.

"A friend loves at all times . . . " (Proverbs 17:17)

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GOD wants us to choose friends carefully.

#### How should your friends treat you?

--They need to be kind to you; they need to be honest, caring, helpful, thoughtful and loving.


#### How should you choose your friends?

- --Carefully consider: Do they love God?
- --There are bad consequences for choosing wicked or mean people, so be careful.

"A righteous man is cautious in friendship, but the way of the wicked leads them astray." (Proverbs 12:26)

Activity page #3 provides an opportunity to discover how God treats His friends and then on page #4 you will see how Abraham demonstrated his friendship with God. These actions of Abraham will be discovered in future stories about his life.


Word pictures can help us understand Biblical Truth.



- --We do things for others with our hands.
- --God does not have hands, true.
- --Referring to "God's hands" in the Bible, pictures how He does things for us; He is at work in us and for us.

Parents: Remember, God has recorded for us all the things He wants us to know. There will be "missing details" that cause us to wonder, but we certainly do not want to make assumptions or arguments "based on silence". Help your children in their study to always accept what God says and not worry about what He does not tell us. That's where our faith becomes stronger.

Terah was 70 years old when his first born son, Abram, was born. He had two other sons--Nahor and Haran. All of their ancestors had moved into the area of the Chaldeans, south of the Tower of Babel, and settled in the city of UR.

Remember, God had scattered the people from Babylon all over the face of the whole earth. (Gen. 11:8,9) Why? because of the sinful pride of their hearts and disobedience to God.


Terah's family settled first in UR and while living there the three sons married. Terah's youngest son, Haran, had a son named Lot, but Haran died there in *"UR of the Chaldeans"* while his father, Terah, was still alive. Nahor's wife was Milcah. Abram's wife was Sarai, and sadly, she could have no children.

Even though their home in UR was a good place to live, Terah decided to take his family and move north into the land of Canaan. Abram, Sarai, and Lot, Terah's grandson, set out from UR together. When they came to Haran they decided to settled there and Terah lived to be 205 years old and then he died in Haran.

In future lessons you will learn about Abram and Sarai's names being changed, and why?


## Abram's Ancestors

Isaiah 41:9-13, 20


- Read the verse and find the things that **God will** do for us when He is our friend.




